Thursday 22nd February Talk: Bees and pollinators

Botley Meadow Bees observe natural beekeeping methods. Mark Sandham has kept bees for about 12 years and classes himself as a hobbvist beekeeper. Initially, his aim was to offer honey and beeswax products locally and to spread the word of how wonderful bees are and the mportance of supporting them. Mark can be seen at outreach events such as Blenheim Palace Flower Show and Science Oxford Centre as well as helping journalists and serving as one of the county's swarm catchers.

This is a relaxed workshop with no previous experience needed, perfect to enjoy with friends or as a gift for Mother's Day.

Talk: Skywave Gin

Skywave gin is the result of adventureloving founders Rachel Hicks and Andrew Parson's pursuit of the perfect gin. Their awards and accolades are numerous. This talk is all about gin: the science of its production and botanicals. The Oxfordshire growers provide rhubarb and apples while village hedgerows are foraged for blackberries. Completing their local heritage, mineral water from Oxfordshire's Blenheim Palace is used. Taster samples will be distributed during the event and bottles will be available to purchase.

Thursday 16th May **Garden visit: Rousham Gardens**

Designed by William Kent in the 18th century, Rousham Gardens feature a wonderful walled garden, an abundance of fruit and vegetables and stunning flowers. Kent was a painter and architect who spent time in Italy - this is reflected in the gardens.

Wednesday 26th June **Garden visit: South Newington House**

Meandering through the tree lined drive leads to 2 acres of garden. Herbaceous borders designed for year-round colour. Organic garden with established beds and rotation planting scheme. An orchard full of fruit trees with pond encouraging wildlife. Walled parterre planted for seasonal colour. A family garden with a small menagerie, all beautifully designed to blend seamlessly into the environment; a haven for all. Then a short walk takes you to a further garden, surprisingly different and worth the walk. To round the visit off, there is a lovely public house close by.

Thursday 19th September

Garden visit: The Grange, Charlgrove

11 acres of delightful gardens include herbaceous borders and a large expanse of prairie planting with many grasses and a wildflower meadow.
